MINUTES OF SECOND MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL HELD ON 24<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2008 AT NIEPMD, Chennai.

2.1 : Confirmation of the minutes of the 1st EC meeting:

The minutes of the 1st meeting of the Executive Council held on 28th August 2007 at New Delhi were read out and confirmed.

- Annual Statement of accounts of NIEPMD for the year 2006-07 (Past ref 1.4)

It was noted that the audit of accounts of NIEPMD for the year 2006-07 was being taken up by the O/o the Principal Accountant General (Civil Audit), Tamil Nadu & Puducherry, Chennai from 28th Jan 2008.

2.2.2: Applicability of CCS Pension Rules -1972 to Central Govt. employees joined NIEPMD after technical resignation: (Past ref 1.5)

It was noted by the Executive Council that the staff of NIEPMD who have joined Govt. service prior to 01/1/2004 and were governed by CCS Pension Rules-1972 in their parent offices before joining NIEPMD service would continued to be governed by CCS Pension Rules-1972 in NIEPMD service and their past services rendered in their parent offices would be counted as combined service in NIEPMD for terminal benefits. The GPF accumulations of such employees were to be transferred to the NIEPMD GPF Account maintained at National Bank (Indian Bank) from the financial year 2008-09.

2.2.3 : Purchase of new vehicle for NIEPMD (Past ref 1.6)

The Executive Council noted that the advertisement notification for recruitment to the posts of Lecturer in Spl Edn (DeafBlind) and Programme Asstt. (Cash & Bills) with revised RRs was issued and published in the employment news with last date for receipt of applications as 16.01.2008.

# 2.4 : Medical re-imbursement to the regular staffs and their dependent family members as per

The Executive Council suggested referring the matter to the Ministry for examining the proposal for adoption of CS (MA) Rules, 1946 in toto for the reimbursement of medical expenses to the regular NIEPMD staff for the OPD treatment.

## 2.5 : Grant of annual book allowance (academic) applicable to medical doctors for academic and research pursuits

The Executive Council approved grant of annual book allowance (academic) to medical officers of NIEPMD having PG Qualification @ Rs.500/- per month and to the medical doctors without recognized PG Qualification @ Rs.300/- per month, from the date of their joining with NIEPMD in accordance with GIO (5) of Appendix 8 of FR & SR (Part-I).

#### 2.6 : Payment of honorarium to Guest Faculty :

The Executive Council noted that the Institute was outsourcing Guest Faculties for various teaching, training, CBR, ADIP programmes and providing services to the persons with multiple disabilities, on need base requirement at the fixed honorarium per session basis. Accordingly, the EC approved the following payment structure of fixed honorarium for the guest faculties and consultants of NIEPMD w.e.f.  $01^{st}$  February 2008, subject to maximum of total emoluments of the corresponding regular post of each category:-

The Executive Council felt the necessity of bringing awareness material for prevention and early detection of disabilities developed by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment. Govt. of India, to be supplied to the Anganwadi Workers and ANMs working in all the districts of Tamil Nadu. EC further suggested making a separate proposal to the Ministry for Grant in aid for this Project instead of utilizing the institute's funds for the purpose, by following the codal formalities of inviting tenders for procurement of awareness materials.

#### 2.9 : Grant of Officiating allowance to Dr. (Mrs) Neeradha Chandramohan :

The Executive Council approved grant of Officiating allowance of Rs.2145/- per month to Dr. (Mrs) Neeradha Chandramohan, Associate Professor, who is officiating as Director, NIEPMD @ 10% of presumptive pay of the additional post i.e. Director (Pay scale Rs.14300-18300), in accordance with FR 49(iii) for a maximum period of three months.

#### 2.10: Deposit of additional amount with CPWD:

The Executive Council noted that the Institute was keeping huge amount of balances in the current account maintained at Indian Bank, which was meant for capital works. As the construction of buildings of the Institute was yet to be taken up, the EC suggested not to deposit any further amount with CPWD for the purpose. Further the Executive Council approved that the capital fund account be deposited under Fixed Term Deposit for a minimum period of six months and the balances of revenue account, if available, under Short Term Deposit Scheme with State Bank of India or any Nationalized bank.

## 2.12 : Engagement of security personnel & house keeping staff on minimum wages basis through contractor:-

The Executive Council noted that the Institute was engaging security personnel and house keeping staff through M/s Lord Jesus Enterprises, Chennai at a total expenditure of Rs.70,000/-The EC approved to engage three additional security guards, while continuing the existing contact for the time being till the new contract come into force after inviting limited tenders for the purpose from the financial year 2008-09.

# 2.13 : Conduct of National Exhibition "Samarthya-2008" :

The Executive Council noted that the Institute organized the National Exhibition-Samarthya 2008 on assistive devices, teaching kits, learning materials, barrier free features for persons with Disabilities during 04-07 January 2008 at St. Joseph's College Grounds, Trichy on the instructions from the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India vide letter It was also noted that 100 organizations from 15 States participated in the exhibition and about was also noted that 100 organizations from 13 states participated in the exhibition and about 35,000 persons from various groups visited the exhibition during the four days. An expenditure of Rs.53,30,518/- was incurred for organising the exhibition under the following heads, which was met out of ADIP funds released by the Ministry for the purpose:

### 2.14: Purchase of new vehicle for NIEPMD:

The Executive Council noted that the Institute was located at distance of 30 kms from Chennai and it depends on the city for outsourcing the vehicles as and when required which was resulting in payment of huge amounts on account of hiring of vehicles including the dead mileage. The EC therefore felt that there was a dire necessity of a vehicle for the Institute for Govt bonafide duties and also for the conduct of camps in and around the Chennai City. Accordingly the Executive Council approved purchase of a vehicle with 9+1 Seating capacity on the DGS&D rates with approx cost of Rs.7.30 lakhs for the Institute.
