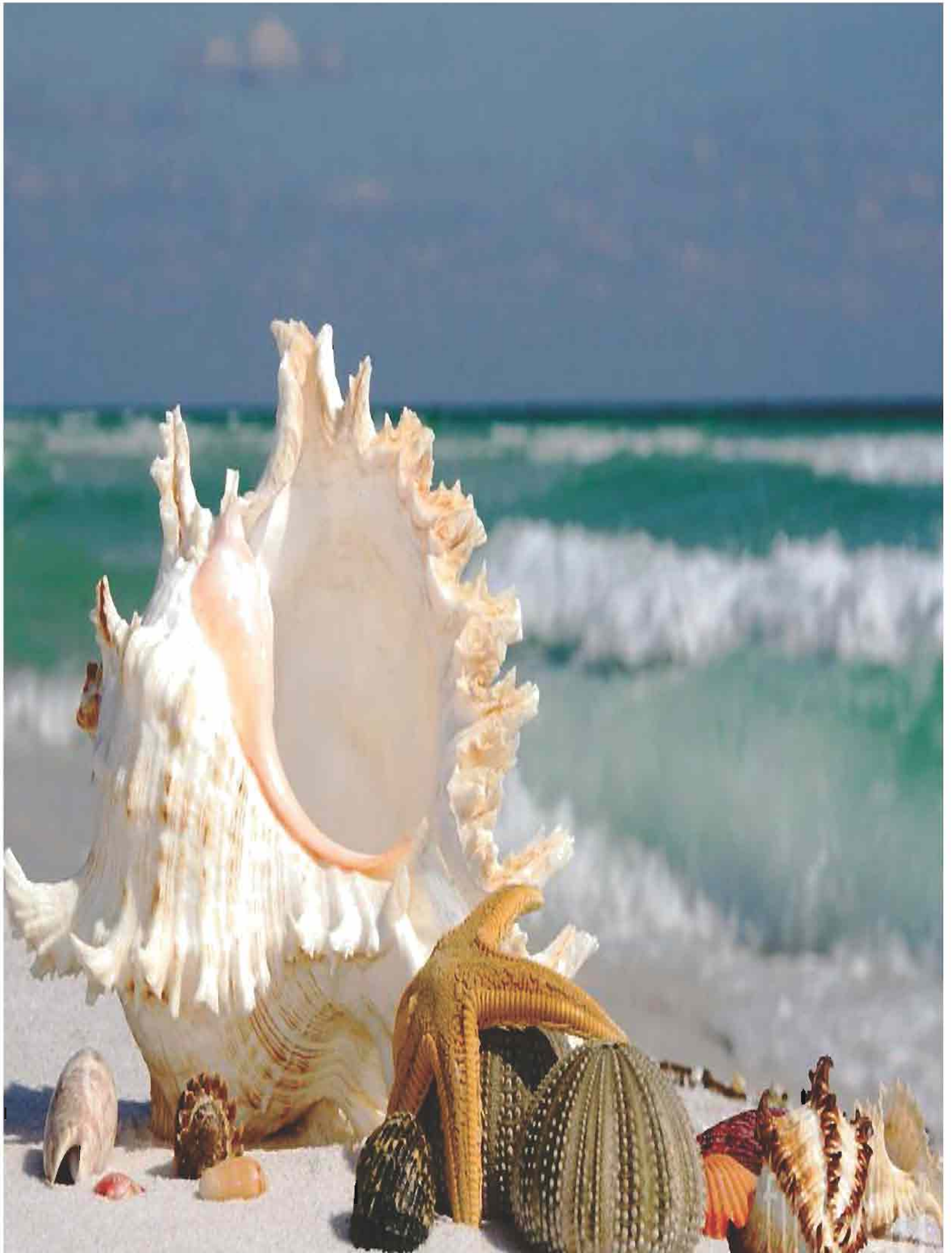

NIEPMD develops multi - disciplinary and inter disciplinary models of services to provide quality care and services through professional approach in the areas of Prevention, Early Detection, Early Intervention, Inclusive education, Skill training and Rehabilitation and services for Persons with Multiple Disabilities. NIEPMD develops protocol of Services, which includes Screening, Assessment, Intervention and Management to improve the quality life of Persons with Multiple Disabilities.

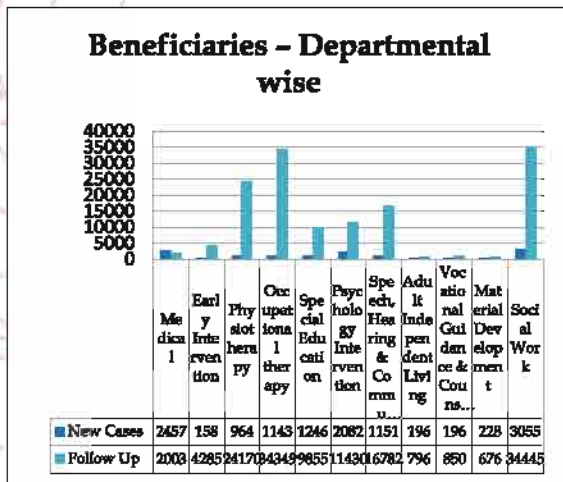
Administrative Structure of NIEPMD



Services

The inter multi-disciplinary team of professionals comprising from departments such as Early Intervention , Medical intervention, Physiotherapy, Occupational therapy, Prosthetics & Orthotics, Special education, Psychological Assessments and Interventions, Speech, Hearing & Communication, Vocational training, Guidance & Counselling, Community Based Rehabilitation, Special Clinics (Psychiatric, Neurology & Ophthalmology) provide services to meet the needs of individuals with Multiple Disabilities. 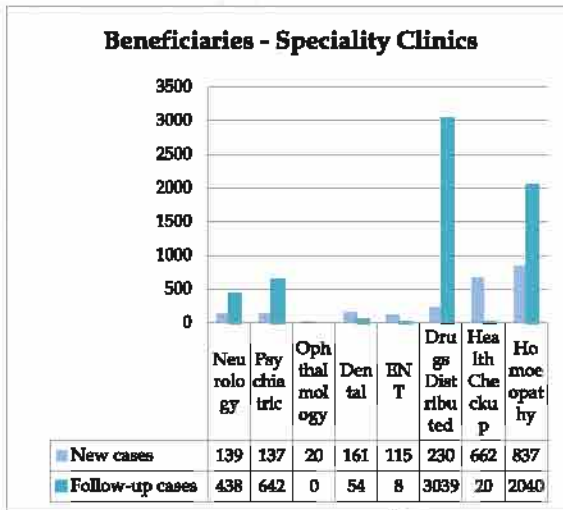
Beneficiaries - Departmental wise



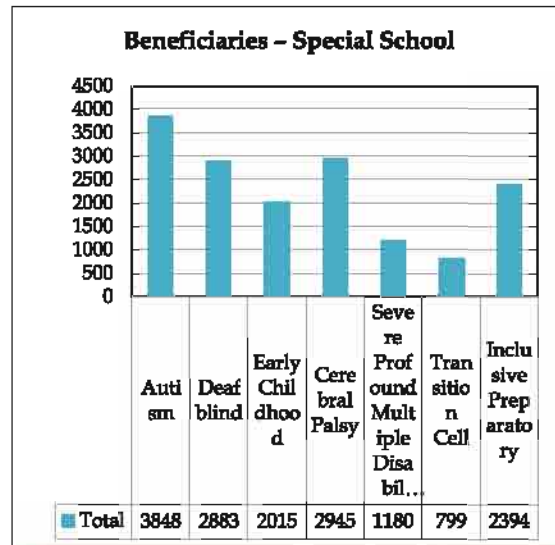
Special School

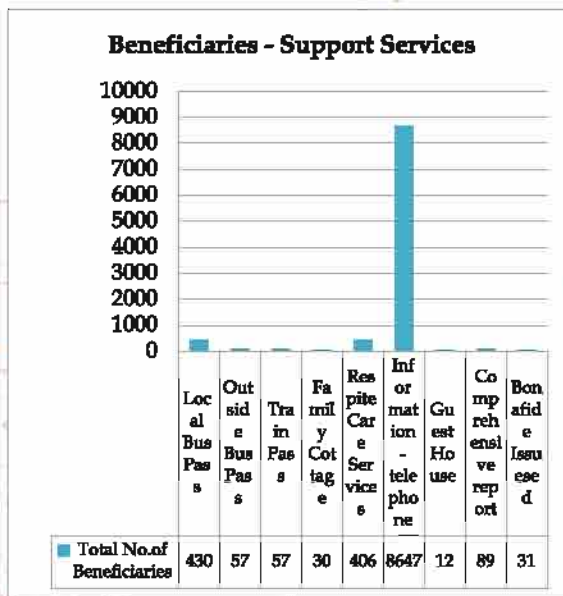
Beneficiaries - Speciality Clinics

Adult Independent Living

Department of Adult Independent Living functions with the objectives of providing adequate support for adults with multiple disabilities to lead an independent life. The service includes assessment, vocational guidance, skill training and vocational training programmes for adults with multiple disabilities. 196 adults were benefited. 133 were trained by skill training program of NIEPMD.

**Human Resource Development**

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Short Term Training Programme

Further, the institute offers various short-term training programs across the nation to strengthen the expertise and experience of the professionals to render the best possible services. Many of these programs are part of Continued Rehabilitation Education (CRE) and are accredited by RCI (*Govt of India*) and implemented through Public-Private Partnership mode across the nation. The NIEPMD organized 163 short-term training programs and 9260 were benefited.

The institute has specialized services, programs and facilities for populace from the SC, ST categories and the North-East of India. The NIEPMD organized program and the benefited.

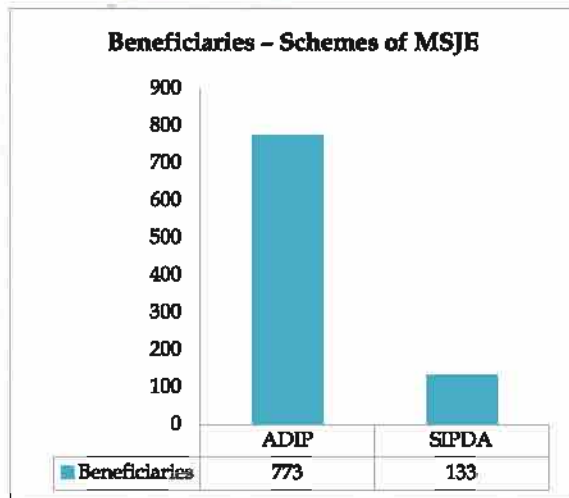
National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation

In addition to conducting the training programs nationally, the institute also conducts examinations for the various levels of programs at a national level through the National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER), a

statutory body under the Rehabilitation Council of India. In the year NIEPMD-NBER conducted examination for 10 courses in 329 institutes all over India.

Schemes

The Institute implements various schemes of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (*Govt. of India*). For instance, under the Assistance to Disabled



Persons for Purchase and Fittings of Aids and Appliances (ADIP) scheme, the institute organises identification, assessment and distribution camps to provide learning kits for Intellectual Disability, Multiple Disability, Autism, Cerebral Palsy and Deafblind apart from Hearing Aid, Prosthetic and Orthotic Aids and Appliances 773 were benefited.

Under the Scheme for Implementation of Persons with Disabilities Act (SIPDA), the institute provides Financial Assistance for Skill Training of Persons with Disabilities

and actively engages in Skilling of Persons with Disabilities in order to equip them for better employment opportunities 133 disabled were benefited.

Corporate Social Responsibilities

NIEPMD is also promoting effective measures on rehabilitation service and to safeguard the rights of disabled persons and to stimulate their inner potentials through CSR activities. The flagship project of CSR initiative is to initiate Skill development program, social participation and development Awareness Program, Promotion Of Sustainable Development, Promoting Hygiene And Go Green, Financial Support to the differently -abled Students and achieving the skill India mission.

Composite Regional Centres for Skill Development, Rehabilitation and Empowerment for persons with disabilities at Kozhikode, Nagpur, Gorakhpur and Andaman and Nicobar were established under the administrative control of National Institute for Empowerment of Persons Multiple Disabilities.

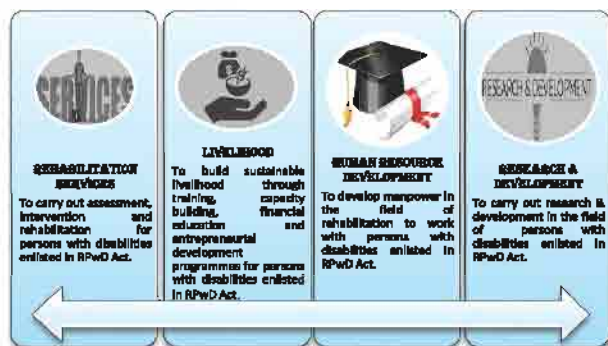

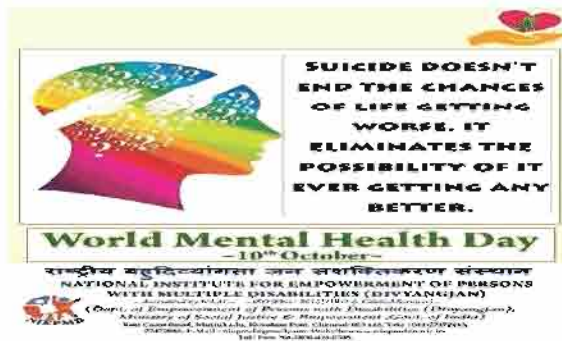

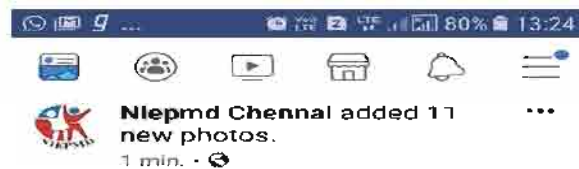

CHAPTER - 3

MEDICAL SCIENCE

The Academic council exercise the following functions.

Guiding in Framing and revising, the curriculum of academic programs, promoting research activities within the institute and planning and executing the overall academic growth of the Institute.

Preamble:

This department aims at diagnosis, prevention, care, health & medical management of persons with multiple disabilities. Referrals are made to NIEPMD Multi Speciality Clinic, various departments and also to hospitals for expert management. Specialty Clinics such as Psychiatry, Neurology, Neurosurgery, ENT & Dental Clinics are conducted regularly. Treatment of rephrase / emergencies, distribution of anti-psychotic & antiepileptic medicines are the other activities of the department. Health care needs of staff and their family members is also addressed by the department.

Objectives:

- Offering playing a key role in diagnosis, prevention, care, health & medical management of persons with multiple disabilities.
- Medical treatment after investigation of clients, if required based on their condition.



- Take up Referrals of the person with disabilities to other units for therapies and educational services.
- Provide high support to families by explaining the condition of their wards and the nature of their disabilities. Clear instructions on intervention, plans and special services required.
- Units of the Department- Early Intervention Services & Multi Speciality Clinics.

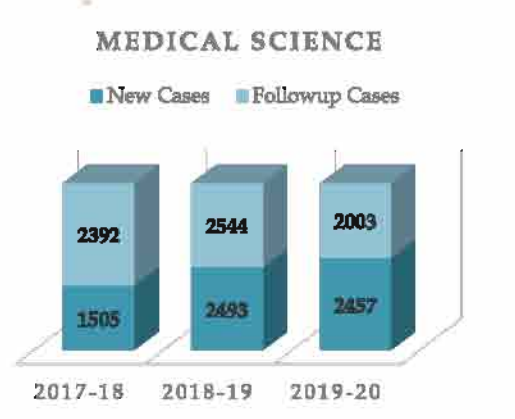
MoU has been made with well-known hospitals like Chettinad Hospital, Global Hospital, Ragas Dental College, Balaji hospital, SRM hospital, Sankara Nethralaya eye hospital. Multispecialty clinics like neurology, psychiatry, ENT, and dental are conducted at NIEPMD.

During the year 2019 - 20 the total number of new clients reported was 2457 and the number of follow up client was 2003. Rare syndromes like Freeman Sheildon syndrome, fibrous dysplasia, Blount's disease, Pierre Robin's syndrome, Parkinson's disease in young people, Segawa syndrome, and Hag land disease have been diagnosed & catered to.

- Conduct specialty clinics.
- Referrals to hospitals for emergencies, surgeries, and in case of co-morbidities like heart kidney and central nervous system diseases. Basic investigations are done in hospitals and clinics.

Super Speciality Clinic

- Multispecialty clinics conducted at NIEPMD are Neurology, Psychiatry, Dental, Neurosurgery, Ophthalmology, homeopathy and ENT clinics

Human Research Development

Certificate Course in Care Giving for primary and advanced level is three & six months; and certificate awarded in convergence with National Trust. The long-term program for Certificate Course in Care giving, is ten months. The roles of the Care Giver is Community Based Service, to provide care and management in various areas of Disabilities and basic care of Health, Nutrition for PwDs. Field visit organized at Vidhyasagar special school, Chennai. Number of students appeared the examination in NT-Primary (3), NT-Advanced (2) and RCI- (7) for the Academic year 2019-20.

NIEPMD extension center Coimbatore conducted the Certificate Course in Care

Giving (10 months). For this academic year (2019-20), fifteen students were admitted.

Early Intervention Unit

Early intervention is a provision of services to such children and their families for lessening the effects of the condition. It can be remedial or preventive (remediating the existing developmental problem or preventing their occurrence).

- The unit provides a Trans-disciplinary approach, which is much effective for the age group between births to six years. It deals with areas like Motor, Cognition, Communication, Socialization, Visual/ sensory and also includes a proper follow up of nutrition diet & health check-up.

- The primary objective of early intervention is to maintain or maximize children's development.

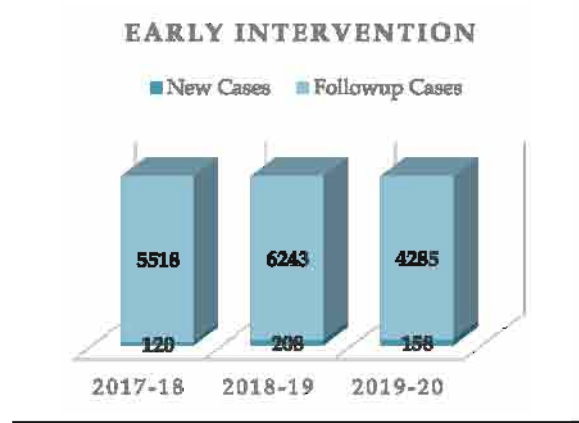
Role of Early Intervention:-

CHAPTER - 4

PROSHETICS & ORTHOTICS

Preamble:

Material development aids and appliances unit devoted to cater the person with neuro-musculoskeletal dysfunction resulting in impaired mobility, coordination and optimal functional outcomes that restrict their functional capabilities and full participation. This unit by intervening with various kinds of assistive technology devices to PwDs helps them to achieve maximum functional capacity and enhancing fruitful participation in day to day activities of life.



Assistive Technological Devices Designed and Developed by Material Development- Aids & Appliances Unit.

Objectives:

To empower the PwDs through the intervention of Assistive Technological devices aiming to regain their mobility, posture control, building confidence, maximizes functional capability and full participation in the society.



Activities:

- Identification and assessment of beneficiaries for the selection and prescription of assistive technology devices
- Design and development of various types of assistive devices
- Measurement and fabrication of assistive devices
- Fitment and training about the assistive device to the beneficiary
- Review, repairing and replacement of various types of aids and appliances.
- Guidance and counselling of beneficiaries about the different types of assistive technology devices.
- Orientation, awareness and training to various stake-holders of society about the importance of assistive devices.
- Implementation of ADIP scheme
- Out-reach and CBR activities
- Conducting Short-term training programme for professionals and non-professional Stake-holders.
- Development of Human Resources in the disability sector to fill the gap between a service provider and user.
- Research and development in the field of assistive device technology.

Service Profile:

Types of Assistive devices provided by the material development unit

Postural Control device - CP Chair, Corner chair and moulded postural control seat are prescribed for children and adolescent with poor postural control and balance. These devices help in maintaining proper posture while sitting and also prevent secondary physical and physiological complications that may arise due to prolonged poor sitting posture. These devices improve physiological function as well as hand functions while performing ADL activities and academic tasks.

Adaptive devices - Customization and /or modification of pre-fabricated/over the counter devices to make suitable for use. Examples of adaptive devices are universal cuff, adaptive writing devices, adaptive utensils etc., are designed and developed in this unit.



Low-cost adaptive devices for ADLs activities

Mobility Devices – Various kinds of mobility device like tri-cycle, wheelchair, crutches, walker, rollator, and walking sticks are modified/customized to make user-friendly.

Orthotic Devices – It is a biomechanical external device applied to the affected body part. It is used for correction, support, prevention and control of a joint range of motion. Various types of the spinal, upper limb and lower limb orthotic devices are manufactured using different kinds of materials that suit the need of user's socio-economical needs.

Prosthetic devices- prosthesis is a replacement of missing body part. It replicates and optimizes the lost body part and function. According to the user's age, occupation and socio-geographical condition, prosthetic devices are prescribed and fitted.

The service protocol involves registration, assessment & prescription, measurement, fabrication, trial, fitment and training of the prescribed appliance followed by the follow-up and reviews schedule for optimal outcomes. As and when required the necessary repairing and replacement of appliances are also taken care of by this unit.

Services offered:

- A. Registration of needy beneficiaries for assistive device technology
- B. Detailed assessment & Prescription of different types of assistive device technology for ADLs, Mobility, Environmental Modification, Classroom seating adaptation, accessibility audits etc.
- C. Design, development, fabrication, fitment and training of various kinds of Orthoses, Prostheses, Adaptive Devices, Mobility Devices etc.
- D. Customization of Pre- Fabricated Assistive Devices.

E. Outreach ADIP Camp across the Pan India

F. Repairing and replacement of Orthotics, Prosthetics, Adaptive and Mobility Devices.

G. Awareness and orientation program to different stakeholders of society regarding the importance of assistive devices in the socioeconomic rehabilitation of persons with disabilities.

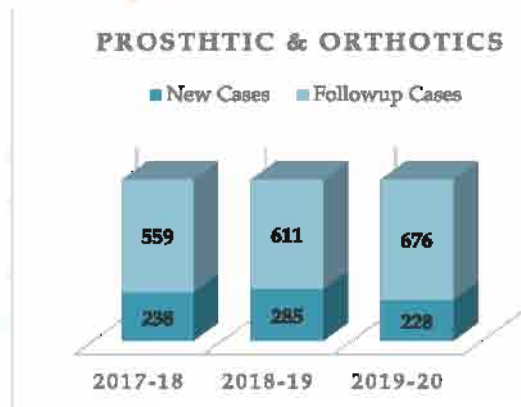

CHAPTER - 5

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOTHERAPY

Preamble

The primary function of the department is twofold teaching and training of HRD students & providing services for persons with movement difficulties to develop, maintain, restore maximum movement and functional ability throughout the lifespan and concerned with physical, psychological, emotional and social well-being thereby improving quality of life of people with disabilities.

A physiotherapist helps in complete initial examination, evaluation, diagnosis, treatment and prescribing suitable orthotic/prosthesis. Physiotherapist suggests home-based exercises for persons with movement difficulties. Physiotherapist closely works with other rehabilitation professionals on planning the treatment program for the children with movement problems associated with other disabilities.

Objectives

- To educate people and society, emphasizing the importance of physical activity and exercise for their well-being.

measurement and fabrication of hand splints in the material development department. Interns from the Loyla College had performed few case studies fitted with aids and appliances.

Parents(Clients): Different categories of PwDs and their parents were benefitted with the intervention of assistive devices like prostheses, orthoses, customized sitting devices, adaptive devices and mobility devices. Majority of the parents/clients were satisfied with the services provided by the department.

Visitors: Visitors from the Govt. and Non- Govt. Organizations, Colleges, Universities, Schools came and enhanced their knowledge in disability field and role of assistive devices in rehabilitation, empowerment, participation in society of PwDs were explained to them.

- To prevent the risk of altered movement behaviour due to poor health, socioeconomic stresses, various environmental factor, lifestyle factors which in turn prevents impairment, activity limitation and participation restriction and disabilities in individuals.
- To habilitate and rehabilitate, a person with disabilities with essential near-normal movements, and maximize his function, capacity and workability to be inclusive in social groups, thereby enhancing their independent living and quality of life.
- To educate and sensitize the general public and administrator about an accessible environment for the disabled by providing a barrier-free environment.
- To sensitize physiotherapist in the field of Multiple disabilities
- Development of models of service delivery in the field of multiple disabilities concerning altered movement behaviour.
- To conduct and coordinate research activities on altered movement behaviours and other relevant areas in the field of

disabilities and multiple disabilities.

The main areas of focus in the department of physiotherapy in NIEPMD for children with multiple disabilities are Neurodevelopment Therapy (NDT), Virtual Reality-Based therapy (VRBT), Pulmonary Rehabilitation, and Electrotherapy & Gait training. The department also consists of Electrotherapy unit which is more commonly used for pain management and muscle re-education.



NDT is a holistic and interdisciplinary clinical practise model informed by current and evolving research that emphasizes individualized therapeutic handling based on movement analysis for rehabilitation and rehabilitation of individuals with neurological pathophysiology.



The aim of the treatment for children with disabilities due to brain damage is to prepare and guide them towards their greatest possible independence and to prepare them for as normal adolescences and adult life.

Gait training or gait rehabilitation is the act of learning/relearning how to walk, either as a child or more frequently, after sustaining an injury or disability.

Gait training helps to strengthen muscles, improves balance and posture, develops muscle memory, builds endurance, and retrains the legs for repetitive motion.

Bodyweight Unweighing system is advanced training equipment which enables early facilitation of gait in a paediatric and adult population with Multiple disabilities.

Electrotherapy is derived from the word Electro - Electric Current / Electrical Energy, Therapy - Treatment of disease, Non-surgical treatment approach. It means various forms of therapeutic applications using electrical energy as a primary source. Electrotherapy is mainly used for pain management, treatment of neuromuscular dysfunction improves range of joint mobility, tissue repair, acute and chronic oedema, peripheral blood flow, iontophoresis, urine and faecal incontinence.

LASER Therapy is advanced electrotherapy treatment which has a profound effect on tissue healing and acts as a powerful anti-inflammatory agent.

Virtual Reality-Based therapy (VRBT) is a new generation tool for advanced rehabilitation which uses motion sensor (Gestures) technology to capture patient movements

which can be associated with therapeutic games as a treatment regime. VRBT incorporates therapeutic techniques such as positional stretch, tone facilitation and inhibition through the game which makes therapy session enjoyable and the patient gets benefited through motor relearning and patterning of movement using visual cues so they will stay self-motivated and engaged throughout rehabilitation regime.

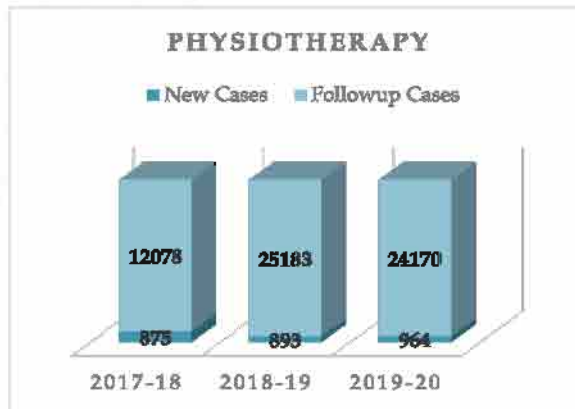
Pulmonary Rehabilitation: Pulmonary Rehabilitation is provided for clients with respiratory problems. Breathing lab is the advance virtual reality-based breathing technique which improves Lung volumes, resistance on expiration and mobilise secretion. It also provides a general relaxation for anxiety patient, Reduce heart rate, slows down breathing and suppress fight and flight response. Advanced diagnostics equipment had

been install to access the pulmonary function (Pulmonary function test).

Cause of disability: Child was born by caesarean section, a birth cry was normal. The child was of low birth weight and

neonatal seizures. The child was kept in NICU for 30 days.

Past History: Child came to NIEPMD at 3 years of age and underwent detailed Physiotherapy assessment. He was identified to have difficulty in getting from sitting and was unable to stand and walk. He was able to sit without support and moved by bottom shuffling. He was then started on regular physiotherapy intervention with case-specific treatment design.

Intervention: Child receives regular physiotherapy in the form of

- Neurodevelopmental Therapy (NDT) Balance Training
- Gait Training

In NDT unit, the focus of the intervention was on facilitation of the upper limb, lower limb and trunk control training. Due to pre ambulatory training the child

was able to crawl and come to kneeling. He was trained to stand from sitting with minimal support. The child was also trained to balance in standing and gait training was done in a parallel bar after

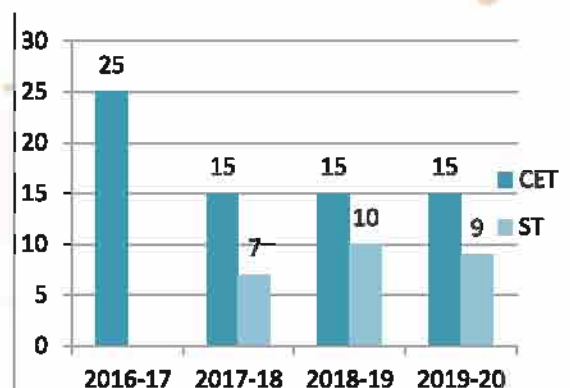
which he was able to come to standing from floor sitting with minimal support. He also achieved a few seconds of independent standing. He is now able to walk a few steps with a rollator. The child showed improvement in gross motor function measure (GMFM Scale) which has improved from 49.4% to 60.8% due to regular physiotherapy treatment.

Occupational Therapy (OT) is a client centered health profession concerned with promoting health & well-being through occupation. The primary goal of Occupational Therapy is to enable the person to participate in the activities of everyday life. Occupational Therapy plays a major role in the field of rehabilitation for persons with Multiple Disabilities (Divyangjan).

Objectives:

- Occupational Therapy Section (Department of Therapeutics) comprises of professionals to fulfil the objectives of NIEPMD, working towards independence of performance areas like work, play, ADL and leisure among persons with disability.
- To carry out Occupational Therapy assessment,

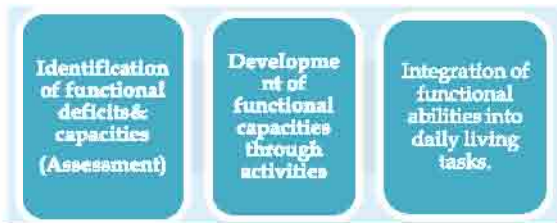

The major roles of Occupational Therapy



Occupational Therapy Activities

In the Occupational Therapy session, services are provided to the person with Multiple Disabilities, Cerebral palsy, Intellectual Disabilities (ID), Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), Attention Deficit Disorder(ADD), Specific Learning Disorder (SLD), Low vision (LV), Neurological disorders, Psychiatric

conditions /Mental Illness and other Developmental Disabilities.

Occupational Therapists evaluate individual capacity &performance levels to provide prevocational training and work station modification.

Services in Occupational Therapy

Varieties of training are provided to the beneficiaries through several sub-units like Multi-Sensory stimulation unit for the children with ASD, children with low vision etc., It mainly focuses on Auditory Integration Therapy (AIT), Visual Integration Therapy (VIT), Visual Motor Training and other sensory deficits related to ADL and Hand Function. Psychiatric unit was established to improve the quality of the life of persons with mental illness and their family members.



Occupational Therapy Intervention:

Occupational therapy treatment encompasses all performance areas.

Therapy goals are designed and implemented based on individual needs. Occupational Therapist uses a wide range of techniques including purposeful activities, play activities, orientation programs, family member's education, prescription of aids and appliances, splinting, wheelchair training, home, workspace and environmental modification, group therapy, home program and vocational training

Occupational Therapists (O.Ts) use purposeful activities to enhance and encourage skill development. Considering the client's interests, the therapist provides a fun and motivating activities that aim to provide a "just-right challenge", so that the person will develop the underlying skills needed to effectively complete the functional tasks. Occupational Therapy offers creative solutions and alternatives to compensate for functional limitations.

Gross Motor Skills	• Pertaining to movement of the large muscles in the arms, legs and trunk
Fine Motor Skills	• Pertaining to movement and dexterity of the small muscles in the hands and fingers.
Neuromotor Skills	• Pertaining to the underlying building blocks of muscle strength, muscle tonicity, postural mechanisms and reflex integration
Adaptation/Modification	• Prescription of Splints & adaptive devices for clients with neurological/Orthopedic/Geriatric clients.
Visual Motor Skills	• Referring to a child's movement based on the perception of visual information.

Sensory Integration	• The ability to take in, sort out and respond to the information we receive from the world.

The sensory enriched environment created in Multi-Sensory stimulation

Room uses everyday objects to arouse the senses (hearing, sight, smell, taste and touch). This way it enhances the child to participate/explore a safe and joyful stimulating environment that provides the age-appropriate and enjoyable activity.



b. Sensory Integration Therapy

Sensory Integration Therapy aims to help the child with sensory by exposing them to several activities in a structured and repetitive way. Children with Autism Spectrum Disorder, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, Visual Impairment, Hearing Impairment, Learning Disability, Down's Syndrome and Children with psychiatric illness are benefitted by the Sensory Integration Therapy.

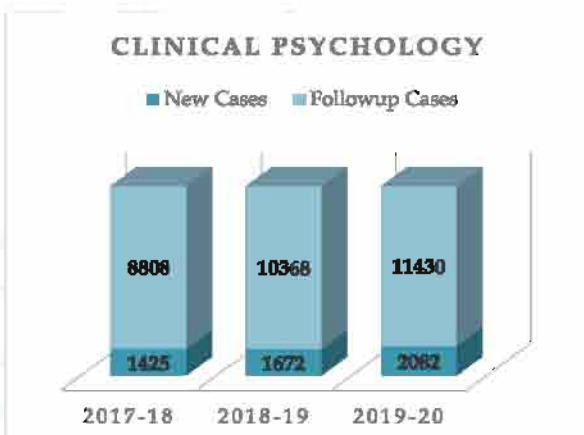

CHAPTER - 8

DEPARTMENT OF SPEECH, HEARING AND COMMUNICATION

Preamble

The Department of Speech, Hearing and Communication extends its services toward fulfilling the objectives of NIEPMD. The department provides services to all age group having issues related with Communication, Feeding, Literacy, Hearing and Balance disorders. The department has a functional Trans-disciplinary group for communication therapy; the first of its kind at an international level and a pioneer model for our country.

Objectives

To undertake the development of human resources for management, training, rehabilitation and education.

- Long term course B.ASLP (four years degree course)
- Training for other college interns.
- Conducting RCI - CRE programs, conferences and seminars.

Promote and conduct research for multiple disabilities.

Develop transdisciplinary approach

The department has been implementing a trans-disciplinary model by various activities beyond the clinical setting. The goal setups for this group are to enhance preverbal skills, socialization skills and motor skills. The group targets to work on the said goals by including activities like; taking attendance of the group for initiation of communication interaction followed by sand play, passing the ball, water play, bowling, ring toss, ring stand, rhymes with actions, pretend to play activities for enhancing the targeted goal.

Undertake service and outreach programs

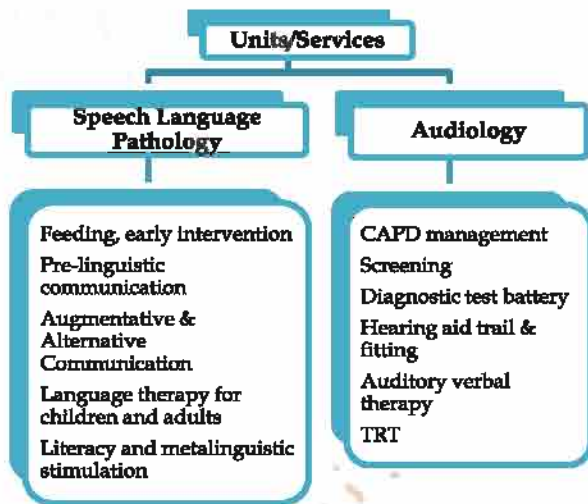
Department activities

The Department has two major units: Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology and its service are Assessment, Management of communication difficulties which is the trans-disciplinary approach in the clinic, literacy issues are addressed by a school.

The department of Audiology assesses hearing and balance issues for clients of all the age range using state of the art equipment like the OAE, ABR, and Immittance, Vestibular /balance

managements are addressed through habitation exercises and other manoeuvres. A detailed assessment of audiology capabilities is done following the Hearing Loss. Assessment units at the department are for i) Audiology, ii) Speech and iii) Language, which offers excellent assessment and management services in the area of Speech, Hearing and Communication.

Specialty clinics / Services Offered in the Department



Audiology

Audiology unit has assessment services for hearing and balance. The test including Tuning fork tests, pure tone audiometry, speech audiometry, Immittance audiometry (Single frequency and multiple frequencies), Otoacoustic

emission test, detailed assessment for tinnitus, Central Auditory Processing disorders and various subjective vestibular assessments are carried out. For management, suitable amplification devices are provided for free of cost under various schemes along with auditory verbal therapy, Tinnitus retraining therapy, sound therapy and various habituation therapies.

ENT Services

The department is also initiated outpatient ENT unit for the children with disabilities as well as for the parents and the professionals. The following are the details

Hearing Aid Troubleshooting

The hearing aid troubleshooting and maintenance services are being provided in Speech and hearing department for various client populations. Initially, on providing a new set of hearing aid the clients are given an orientation on maintenance and usage of Hearing aids. The general instructions on how to use the hearing aids in public, changing of batteries, the volume control, using of tele coil mode, cleaning of the ear tubes and ear tips from wax, and general maintenance and care for the hearing aids

are demonstrated to the clients. Troubleshooting was being done for over 28 clients against improper functioning of hearing aids.

Speech Language Pathology

The speech-language pathology unit has assessment services for all speech and language-related problems in children and adult affected with language-related problems, swallowing problems, fluency and articulation in addition to offering management services.

Best practices of the Department

The transdisciplinary model of communication therapy is implemented by carting together occupational therapy, speech therapy, special education and parents. This approach enhances communication development by simultaneously facilitating gross motor, fine motor, pre-literacy skills etc. Here the common plan is devised for the group and the targets are addressed through the play-way method. The parental participation along with the therapist is ascertained to extend the therapy activities beyond the clinical settings. The expected goals for the groups are to enhance preverbal skills, socialization skills and motor skills. The group targets to work on the set goals by including activities like taking attendance of the group for initiation followed by sand play, passing the bell, water play, bowling ring toss, ring stand for enhancing the target goal.

Clinical Conference

The department had regularly conducted clinical conferences to ensure the quality of client services and to update the current technologies. Case discussions were held along with the client, parent,

therapists of the client from each unit and experts in the specific areas the professionals in the team presents the child's current skills and intervention goals in their area of expertise. This initiation which had taken family priorities and concerns into account had helped to develop a child's skills holistically.

Cause of Disability : Idiopathic

Past History: When the child was brought he had no meaningful words. He cried to convey everything and used gesture. He had poor eye contact, poor attention span and behaviour issues.

Assessment: The child was assessed in detail and reports states that he does not play with other children, comprehends single word command like "no come go" Predominately expresses by cry children, comprehends by cry or Vocalisation, first word was not yet achieved, has exploratory play. His preverbal concepts like eye contact, turn taking copying were not achieved, child's motor development was stated to be age appropriate and oral motor examination reveals normal in

structure, adequate in function with intact vegetative skills.

Speech Therapy: The child was recommended to attend speech therapy both individual (30 minutes) and group therapy (40 minutes) sessions for twice a week. The child was attending speech therapy continuously since March 2020

Intervention: The child was given indirect language stimulation approach, through play modality which included parents as the Co-therapist. The sessions included language stimulation techniques like self-talk, parallel talk, role play, role reversals, modelling, prompting, imitation, drilling, reauditoization. Integration of speech activity along with motor activity was mainly focused in group therapy sessions. Generalisation of therapy session was carried forward at home.

Post intervention report: The parent's states that the child shows interest towards parents talk, child repeats after parents or speaker, child could imitate parent's speech. He has progressed to self-pretend play, could speak meaningfully eight- twelve words, has attained eye contact for span of one minute and can take turns on command. He has also achieved the concept of object permanence. Language age of child as

Hence, the child from being nonverbal could now express his thoughts in single words and comprehend simple sentence.

Purpose of visit:

The child was brought to NIEPMD with a complaint of poor academic performance, and communicating only in single words and poor speech clarity.

Assessment:

A detailed speech and language evaluation revealed, delays in comprehension and expression. He could comprehend simple verbal commands, most common nouns, and comprehension of adjectives and prepositions were emerging. He could not comprehend grammatical markers. Expressed wants and needs through the use of single words, predominantly nouns and verbs. Speech intelligibility was poor with misarticulations of several phonemes.

CHAPTER - 9

DEPARTMENT OF SPECIAL
EDUCATION**Speech and Language Intervention :**

He has been attending one-on-one speech and language therapy twice a week at NIEPMD for the past one year. Therapy was focused on improving his language skills and speech intelligibility.

Progress following intervention:

Presently he exhibits age adequate comprehension - he understands complex commands, synonyms, antonyms, PNG markers, tense markers, case markers, participial constructions, interrogatives and narratives. He answers questions from the story, using sentences. He expresses through sentences of 4-5 words. He consistently uses PNG markers, tense markers, prepositions, and interrogatives. He speaks in fairly grammatical sentences and is able to convey his thoughts and needs effectively. His speech intelligibility has improved significantly. His speech is intelligible to unfamiliar listener, even when the context is unknown.

The improvements in speech and language abilities has also been reported by his teachers and is also evident in the improved peer interaction.

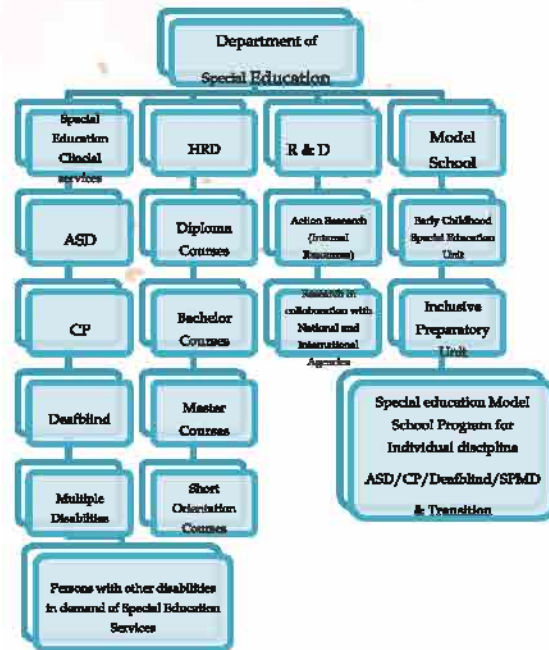
The Department of Special Education, National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities established in 2004 focus on Special Education clinical services, training HRD's through various courses from diploma level to masters level and all to contribute the holistic development of Person with Multiple Disabilities. Special Education is specially designed instruction to meet the needs of persons with disabilities. It follows the guidelines of various educational facilities for persons with disabilities and tries to develop the service delivery models from exclusion to inclusion, to promote community participation of persons with multiple disabilities.

Objectives

- To provide appropriate service delivery model including Special Educational Assessment and follow up program for individuals with multiple disabilities.
- To gain Professional skills among Human Resources Trainees in the field of special education who will

Services offered in the Department

The Department of Special Education is providing Special Education services to the children with Multiple Disabilities. The Special Education services of the department are divided into five units depending on the need and the type of disability.

Special Education Model School Program for Multiple Disabilities

Multiple Disabilities unit is one which Special Education services for children having more than one disability.

work with the individuals with Multiple Disabilities

- To provide home based program and integrated programs for children with special needs.
- To prepare teaching learning materials and adaptive devices for facilitating the functions of persons with Multiple Disabilities is part of the program of the department.
- To facilitate inclusive education and develop the training modules for in-service teachers and other professionals to carry out the task of inclusive education.
- To create least restrictive environment-by having an inclusive model class room for children with disabilities, right from toddlers.
- To promote the quality of life and facilitating the clients with Severe and Profound Multiple Disabilities to live as close as possible with their family and community.
- To promote successful Rehabilitation following a Trans-disciplinary approach.
- To provide transitional training program for enrolment in vocational program.

The assessment is comprehensive one, which includes a detailed assessment on the developmental areas, sensory issues (in case of autism) social and communication skills, and current academic performance of children with Multiple Disabilities. These help children in determining their current functional level such as Pre-primary, Primary, Secondary, and Prevocational level. A graduated approach is used for identification and necessary program planning for children with Multiple Disabilities. The follow up services will be carried using **functional assessment** and careful planning of **Individualized Education Plan** by setting goals and objectives. To achieve the objectives, appropriate teaching/learning strategies are developed and individual sessions are held to the children with Multiple Disabilities twice or thrice in a week for about 30-40 minutes session each. The services are need-based and individualized in nature. The activities such as art, craft, music, painting, finger printing, thumb impression and games is being conducted as part of the follow up program. A range of **Evidence based Intervention** has been put into practice in the Special Education program for children with Multiple Disabilities.

Following the **Social Model** in the Special Education services, parents & siblings get trained in the special education services to carry out the activities at home.

Special Education - Deafblind unit Center for Deafblindness has unit of clinical services for the children or individuals with Deafblindness, hearing impairment, visual impairment or any other associated conditions with sensory impairment. A comprehensive detailed assessment on the Functional vision and hearing, Learning media assessment, Orientation and Mobility, Assistive technology assessment. The Special Education services provided for sensory impairments, congenital and adventitious condition of disabilities.

The IEP is planned and follow up services include the academic and plus curricular skills to improve the performance of the child on one to one instruction in academic skills, communication, mobility and orientation along with other required plus curriculum skills.

Special Education Model School Program for ASD

Center for Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) under the Department of Special Education of Persons with ASD, the



special education has initiated separate clinical services for children with ASD. This unit aims at serving children with ASD on one on one instruction. Specific assessment for ASD – PEP, APEP, TTAP, ABLLS and PECS are done to understand the goals to be achieved for the individual children. The goals are selected based on the need of the individuals and in consultation with parents. Each child attends individually to bring out utmost skill development. Strategies like structured teaching, skills along with Visual schedules, PECS, etc. used for development of communication are part of intervention planning. Customized TLMs are available in the unit for meeting out the needs of children with ASD.

The children are referred to the ASD clinic after general assessment. Each child is assessed specifically for functional skills at the ASD unit and the goals are developed for the child. Follow up schedules are fixed considering the needs of the child and parent. Each session lasts for 45 minutes; apart from academic skills, co-curricular activities like arts, crafts, mime, drama, and play are planned for children's holistic development. Children studying in inclusive school visit unit for remedial

training. Functional skills necessary for career transition are also provided.

Special Education Model School Program for Specific Learning Disabilities

Center for Specific learning disabilities was initiated as a unit under the Department of Special Education for Special Education services of children with learning difficulties and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder. After the diagnosis and assessment, a detailed comprehensive assessment using assessment tools will be done. Depending on the performance and current level of the children with SLD, after discussion with parents, IEP goals will be taken and follow up Services are carried out to improve the attention, perception, visual – auditory processing to promote literacy skills in reading (dyslexia), writing (dysgraphia), arithmetic(dyscalculia) and motor coordination (dyspraxia). The children who are attending the special education services in the SLD unit are studying in inclusive schools. Follow up services will be given twice in a week. Using Direct and differentiated instruction and following are the strategies to overcome the difficulties: series of activities to improve reading



fluency and comprehension, use concrete manipulatives, Task analysis, Self-questioning, multi-sensory activities and small group teaching

Special Education Model School Program for Cerebral Palsy

A clinical service of Special Education at NIEPMD for persons with Cerebral Palsy (CP) was established as separate unit. The persons with various types of CP like, Spastic, Athetoid, Ataxic and Mixed, with different degree of severity are availing need based intervention with appropriate adaptations and assistive technology for communication, reading, writing, holding objects, etc.

After initial assessment in the Department of Special Education at the time of admission, the clients will be assessed in detail by using age appropriate standardized tools like FACP, Carolina, MDPS and GLAD. The Individualized Educational Program will be written for selected long term and short term goals and specific objectives as part of program planning and intervened accordingly. The program would be followed and parents will also be trained at particular goals and asked to follow the same at home. Home program would be suggested by the clinical staff and make

home visits to design the activity and check the progress. The intervention is carried out through different kinds of activities by following variety of teaching strategies of music, movements, games, with required adaptations.

Group activities are conducted twice a week. During the intervention program the care is taken on seating, positioning, posture, carrying, attention, eye pointing and eye tracking. The clients with cerebral palsy will be seated in corner chairs, head resting chairs. Head pointers will be used for pointing out the objects, pictures, words etc. adapted pencils with pencil grippers, hand coughs used for appropriate grip and holding for writing. The preference of area of intervention is on basic activities of daily living like brushing, bathing, toileting, eating and dressing and parents will be training on the same aspects and being followed. Adaptions are made for ADL - tumblers, spoons, plates, toilet adaptations that are also demonstrated to the parents in order to follow at home.

Departmental Activities in the respective Units are as follows:

1. Strengthen IFSP (Individualized Family Service Plan)



2. Parent Training and Motivational Program
3. Action Research
4. Technology based intervention (Using multi media)
5. Conduction of physical games as one of the teaching strategy

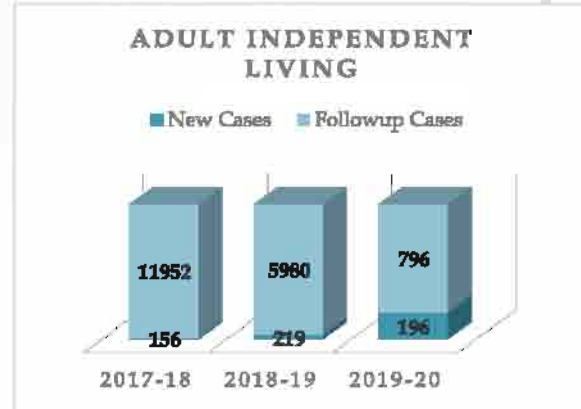

- To enable the beneficiaries to make the best use of the rehabilitation services in an institution and the community;

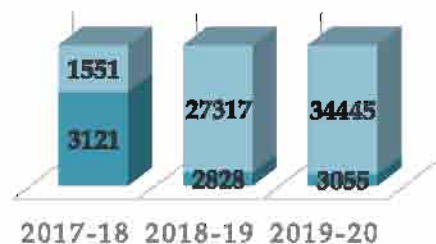

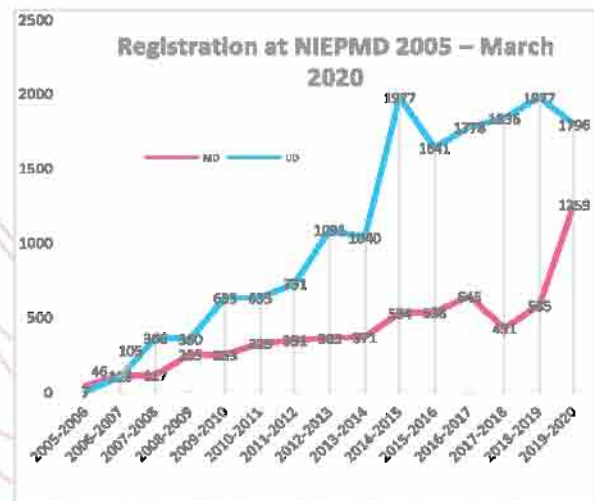
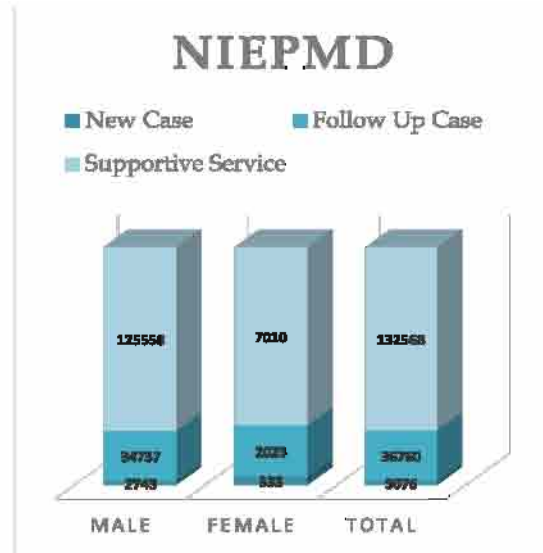

CHAPTER -12 EXTENSION AND OUTREACH SERVICES

Preamble

A large number of persons with disabilities living in rural, far-flung and remote areas do not get the attention that the persons with disabilities living in urban areas get. To make the services available - evaluation, assessment, diagnosis, therapy, fitment, counselling and creating awareness, Outreach and Extension services are provided by NIEPMD. In line with NIEPMDs work to promote new strategies to reach persons with disabilities of the different age group of different categories with different needs. NIEPMD Extension Centres started functioning at the following three places:

- Port Blair, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, till Dec 2019.
- Chengalpattu Medical college, Chengalpattu.

A team of a multidisciplinary team equipped with diagnostic equipment and fitment aid provide services by camping rural and far-flung areas. Also, they guide local NGOs of the rural areas, in setting up service centres, pre-schools & Vocational training centres. NIEPMD supports, (Technical support on need and expertise based on a consultancy basis) distribution

of Aids and Appliances under ADIP Scheme, Parent Training Programmes, Short Term Training Programmes (Seminar, Conference, Workshops, Training programmes, Awareness programmes, Conducting Special events for children/persons with disabilities, Special programme for (PMSTP/SIPDA/R&D/HRD) for SC/ST/North East Regions etc. It is ensured from the technical side to make the Extension Centre function at the fullest by engaging skilled manpower in the centre and providing well-structured quality services to the clients.

Objectives of the Extension Centres:

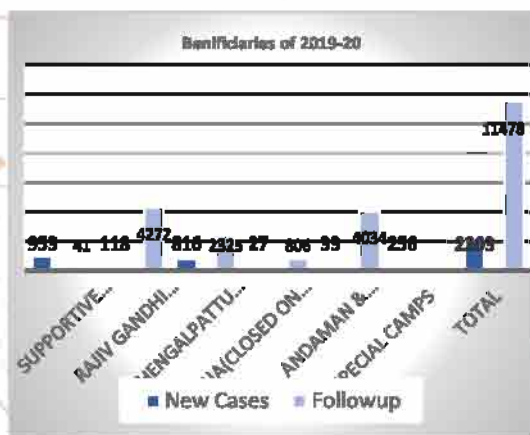

CHAPTER - 13

LIBRARY AND INFORMATION CENTRE

Preamble:

The Central Library of NIEPMD is equipped with all modern facilities. It caters to the information needs of staff, HRD students, organizations of the disability sector and community including Government functionaries, Rehabilitation Professionals, Persons with disabilities (Divyangjan) and their parents. It continues to march its mission of facilitating the dissemination of new knowledge through its acquisition. It offers various services to the users including reference, membership, circulation, document delivery, resource sharing and information alert service. It has a rich collection of information resources in the form of CD-ROMS, E-journals, E-books, books, Braille books, journals, thesis and reports. Library and Information services continue to expand resources for the benefit of the staff and students of NIEPMD during the year 2019-20. It plays an important role in furthering the academic & research mission of NIEPMD and facilitates the creation and dissemination of knowledge. It has an excellent print collection of more

than 4000 volumes of books, journals, thesis, reports, standards and pamphlets. It also provides access to more than 1000 electronic books and journals related to disability and Rehabilitation. It also has printout and photocopying service to the library clientele as per library rules.

RTI Act 2005

NIEPMED has implemented the Right to Information Act 2005 as per the norms of Central Information Commission, Government of India and Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan). The Right to Information Act 2005 (RTI) is an act of the parliament of India to provide for setting out the practical regime of right to information for citizens to secure access to information under the control of public authorities, in order to promote transparency and accountability in the working of every public authority. The Central Public Information Officer headed by the Director of the Institute who is the appellate authority is responsible for providing information. The Public Information Officer serves as the liaison officer and handles correspondence with the authorities concerned. The institute received 105 RTI applications during the year 2019-20 and replied to the queries within the stipulated time. The quarterly returns pertaining to RTI are filed and submitted to the Central Information Commission through online as per the prescribed guidelines.

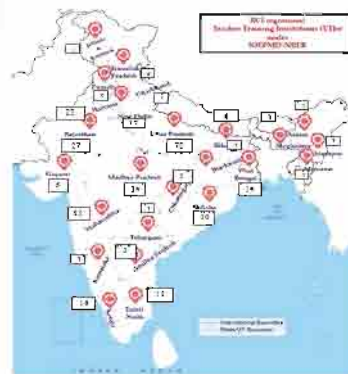

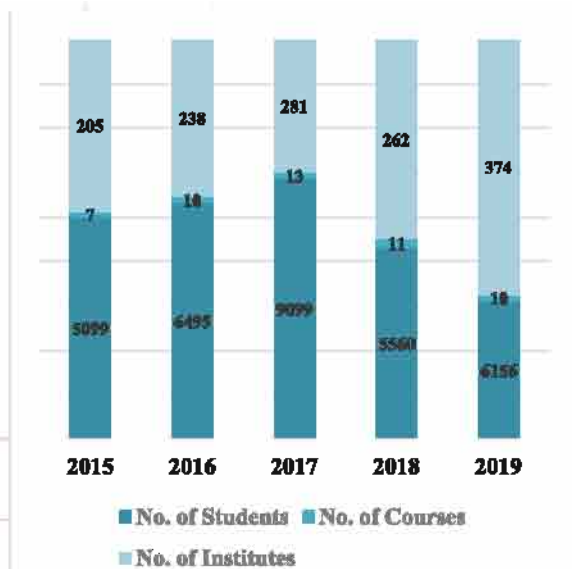
Examination Centre - Kendriya Vidyalaya

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Overview:

This program focused on analyzing the potential and providing training for developing the skills of adults with multiple disabilities in NIEPMD.

SHORT DESCRIPTION:

This program upgrades the adults with multiple disabilities through Department of Adult Independent Living in NIEPMD by enhancing their skills through skill based training, which will foster them in securing a better livelihood. This program was conducted in Collaboration with Chennai Petroleum Corporation Limited, focusing on improving the skills of each person through a special program conducted for the duration of 6 months covering 20 beneficiaries in 2 batches. The program was pertaining to the field of creation of Handlooms, Arts and painting and Artistic creation. The skill development training for a batch with 8 persons had been completed on 19.06.2019 and the beneficiaries were distributed with a material kit and sublimation printing equipment for the purpose of encouraging the skills of children at NIEPMD. 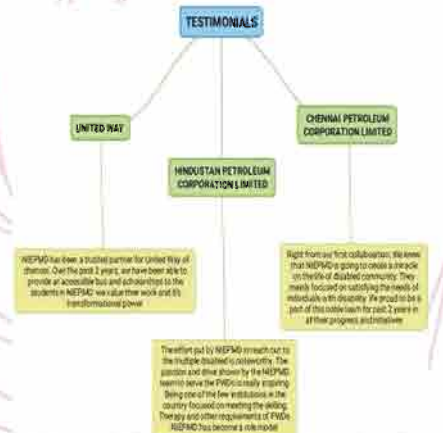

**Initial Assessment, Assessment Tools
Used, Setting Goals, Strategies, Progress
Monitoring, Evaluation and Assistive
Devices & Technology**

CRC-K has centre based and outreach clinical services. Clients report to CRC as referred case or they attend directly.

The initial assessment for these clients is carried out by the Social Work and Placement Unit. Preliminary assessment collects data on the basic socio-demographics, history of present condition, details of social work assessment schedule of the clients unit for clinical/ non-clinical services. After detailed initial assessment, cases are referred to concerned department. Each department evaluates the client in detail to elicit their present complains, past history, family history, past medical history, treatment and therapy history etc. which is followed by a detailed clinical examination. Based on the diagnosis an action plan is evolved for therapeutic interventions. Follow up dates for therapeutic sessions are informed to clients who are in need of regular follow-up. Cross references and discussions within departments as demanded by each individual case are done based on a transdisciplinary approach. The Social Work Unit functions as the coordination point. For each client,

CRC-K has standardized brief case sheet and detailed case record booklet comprising details of each department.

Standardized Assessment Tools are used by each department of CRC-K. Based on the detailed evaluation, realistic goals are set and strategies are planned accordingly. Periodic review of the progress is conducted by each department. Inter-departmental discussions as needed are carried out periodically to assess the progress and to monitor and evaluate the outcome of therapeutic interventions. Clinical meetings are conducted to discuss cases of academic interest.

SERVICE DELIVERY MODEL AT CRC-K

Department of Special Education:

- The department follows 'individualized Family Support Plan (IFSP)' method in special education clinical services. Here, the Instructor and Special Educator, ensures the participation of all family members in the teaching learning processes of the child through systematic lesson plan procedure.
- The department provides one-month clinical internship for D. ED students in various reputed institutions across the state.

Department of Speech & Hearing:

- The department has started parental empowerment for development of speech language and communication skills among children with disabilities. The use of live video of speech therapy about specific technique, power point presentation, and regional language hand outs simple pictures etc were used to empower parent. This activity has given significant changes in the area of speech language and communication skills of children with disabilities. As parent started spending effective quality time for developing communication skills among children with disabilities, this has given positive outcome towards development of communication.

Department of Occupational Therapy:

- OT department strongly believes that client centered and family centered approaches are more important to provide effective intervention and best outcomes. Orientation about the condition, medium of treatment process, areas to be focused, limitation of therapy services, necessity of parents' involvement and importance of parents' empowerment, which are used to be provided in the initial days, it gives clarity about our rehabilitation services to the beneficiaries.
- Based on the need of the individual, activities used to be designed and provided with existing materials. It gives opportunity for clients to incorporate their practices in their day to day activities. Theories strongly suggest going with open loop learning process facilitates learning process among people.
- The parents of the clients are involved during the training session. At the best, clients are not taken without parents, if there is in need for that then it would be considered. Along with training session, parents hands on training is also done in therapy session.
- In order to enhance peer group interaction, creating opportunity of participation and functional based intervention, weekly twice

group therapy is conducted at CRC-K for beneficiaries. Parents are involved in the group therapy process, which is helpful for them to get rid from their routine procedure and being stress relief. They get an opportunity interact with other parents; they do appreciate other children participation and their performance in group therapy activity.

- Individualized home program was prescribed for every clients based on their preference and functional capacity. Home program effectiveness was periodically reviewed and changed for better results.

Department of Physiotherapy:

- The department is providing and encouraging evidence-based practices. The department is frequently updating the therapy practices by inculcating the culture of lifelong learning through attending conferences, seminars, online courses, webinars etc. Back walking exercise in treadmill, sibling/peer involved treadmill training/balance training are some of the strategies adopted in 2019-20.
- The department provides various relevant information to parents/clients via the WhatsApp group created among parents/clients visiting the department. Video conferencing is frequently conducted through WhatsApp by parents/clients who

finds difficult to reach the centre in person. Online consultation and goal setting are conducted through WhatsApp. Parents/Clients are encouraged to post the pictures/videos of their child's changes in the WhatsApp group. Thus, the Physiotherapy Department is spearheading the practice of using social media for effective rehabilitation as practiced in the western countries.

Prosthetic & Orthotic Unit:

- Communicate appropriate information to the service user and their family or carers.
- Participate in the assessment and evaluation of the service user's needs and goals with a view to developing an effective and appropriate treatment including considerations of device/treatment function and design.
- Formulate prosthetic or orthotic designs, including selection of materials and components which may include mechanical or electronic assistive mobility devices, postural management systems and wheelchairs and other assistive devices.
- Capture anthropometric data including casts, scans, measurements, kinetic and kinematic data and imaging, required for appropriate design, fabrication and fitting.
- Specify and modify physical or virtual, positive or negative models to obtain the optimal design,

function, fit, cosmetic and comfort of devices.

- Conduct the fitting, static and dynamic alignment and initial check-out of devices, and where appropriate, the preliminary training of the service user.
- Be familiar with new techniques, materials, components and products attending Conferences and seminar.

INITIATIVES

Apart from regular clinical, HRD and community based services, CRC-K also implemented several special initiatives for the empowerment of Person with Disabilities.

UNIQUE ACTIVITIES OF CRC KOZHIKODE:

A. SPARSHAM - SPECIAL INITIATIVE IN WAYANAD DISTRICT FOR THE SCHEDULED TRIBE (ST) POPULATION:

Probably the first of its kind initiative in the country to provide all disability related services under one roof for PwDs among the ST population.

Wayanad is the district in Kerala with the maximum number of tribal populations. Majority of them live in isolated remote forest areas in difficultly accessible terrains. Services need to be delivered at their doorsteps. Though there are provisions for general welfare of the tribal population through the tribal department, hitherto no service delivery

provisions were made available specifically for the differently abled population among the tribals.

CRC-K initiated an innovative model project named 'SPARSHAM' for the PwDs belonging to ST community in the Wayanad District, with the aim to facilitate medical board certificates, assistive devices, legal guardianship certificate and UDID under a single umbrella, with the support of District ITDP Department, DLSA, DSJ Department, District Medical Office and District administration.

The official inauguration of this project was done by District Judge Shri. K P John on 18th October at Panamaram. Smt. Sunitha, Sub-Judge, DLSA, Shri. Ceriyan, DPO, ITDP, Dr Roshan Bijlee, Director, CRC-K, Dr Renuka, DMO and Shri Pavithran, DSJ Officer attended the programme.



CRC-K took an extensive effort to study the situation among the tribal population. As an initial attempt, CRC-K in association with LSGDs and Tribal



Welfare Dept. conducted following awareness / training programmes in the district:

- **Awareness programmes:** CRC-K organized an awareness programme on 'Various Schemes and Benefits for PwDs with special Emphasis on ADIP for SC/ST promoters working in Wayanad district with the Support of District Scheduled Tribes Department from 20th to 22nd June 2019 at Sulthan Bathery and Kalpetta, Wayanad.

- **Disability assessment and evaluation camps:** CRC-K in association with LSGDs and Tribal Welfare Dept. conducted 23 disability identification camps exclusively among the tribal colonies in the Sulthan Bathery, Kalpetta and Mananthavady regions of Wayanad district. A total of 496 PwDs were been evaluated by this unique initiative. These camps revealed that none of the PwDs had undergone any specific disability therapeutic intervention measures till date and they were left unattended with their disabilities. Vast majority of them were not even in possession of a disability medical board certificate. Faculties from dept. of Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Speech & Hearing, Special Education, Prosthetic

& Orthotic Unit and Social Work & Placement Unit attended these camps:

B. UNIQUE DISABILITY IDENTITY CARD - ENROLLMENT PROGRAMME:

The DEPwD initiated the project of issuance of UDID card for the PwDs, with

the aim building a holistic and to end integrated system for issuance of UDID and disability certificates for PwDs.

For getting UDID and disability certificates for PwDs, beneficiaries have to submit online applications and upload required documents like Disability Medical Board certificate, Aadhaar card, Photo etc. as mandated in the portal GOI for this purpose. Many of the PwDs are not aware of the UDID card and not know how to apply for it.



For helping the disabled population, CRC-K, as part of Mega Disability Medical Board Certificate issuance camps, has collected thousands of applications from beneficiaries for UDID card for processing. Nearly 1500 applications were received through the out-reach camps. To settle up the pending applications, CRC-K had initiated steps for online enrollment of these applications for UDID cards in a phased manner. Centre based UDID enrollment programme were started at CRC Kozhikode in association with District Medical Office, Kozhikode, with the support of student volunteer group.

H. COVID-19 - MENTAL HEALTH RAPID RESPONSE SERVICES FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES:

- As a very early response, CRC-K in association with Indian Association of Clinical psychology (IACP) Malabar chapter had started a 24x7 COVID 19- Mental Health Rapid Response Service' (RRS) - dedicated helpline number.
- Here, a) Emergency calls (which is only a minority). b) Service requirements / awareness creation requirements / clearing of doubts etc. c) Psychological / counselling service requirement calls are all attended. The 1st & 2nd categories are issues for which general awareness creation, clarification of basic medical queries, updating knowledge, settling of doubts etc. are required. Further needs may be requirement of assistance in availing services from the District Administration, LSGD etc. These issues are attended by the Rehabilitation Officer. The 3rd category of calls which requires proper psychological support mechanism is attended by the Clinical Psychology department of CRC Kozhikode in association with Indian Association of Clinical Psychology (IACP) Malabar chapter, where the voluntary service of nearly 35 RCI registered Clinical psychologists are utilized.
- Online, psychotherapies, counseling services and follow up

services are provided through Whatsapp, IMO, skype etc.

ASSISTANCE TO DISABLED PERSONS FOR PURCHASE / FITTING OF AIDS AND APPLIANCES (ADIP SCHEME)

The ADIP Scheme is in operation since 1981 with the main objective to assist the needy disabled persons in procuring durable, sophisticated and scientifically manufactured, modern, standard aids and appliances that can promote their physical, social and psychological rehabilitation by reducing the effects of disabilities and enhance their economic potential. Assistive devices are given to PwDs with an aim to



improve their independent functioning and to arrest the extent of disability and occurrence of secondary disability.

CRC Kozhikode is a nodal agency for implementing the ADIP scheme in Kerala State. Various camps are conducted in all the districts of Kerala for the identification/assessment of beneficiary and distribution of aids and appliances under ADIP Scheme. Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation, & Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (CRC), Gorakhpur is functioning under the administrative control of National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities (Divyangjan), Chennai (Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India). CRC-Gorakhpur as a composite regional centre was inaugurated by Shri. Yogi Adityanath, Honorable Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh in the gracious presence of Shri. J.P. Nadda, Honorable Minister of Health & Family Welfare and Dr. Thawar Chand Gehlot, Honorable Minister of Social Justice & Empowerment on 2nd September 2018.



CRC-Gorakhpur was established to provide centre-based clinical and community-based rehabilitation services to persons with disabilities (PWDs) in the eastern regions of Uttar Pradesh, including those affected with JE/AES. The construction of a main building of CRC-Gorakhpur is underway within the premises of BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur. CRC - Gorakhpur is committed to providing rehabilitation services to all the disabilities specified in the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016. There are National Institutes and other apex bodies in each area of disability in different parts of India under the same Ministry. The ministry has set up CRCs in different parts of India. CRC at Nagpur has become functional since October 2015. BEST PRACTICES OF THE DEPARTMENT

Team CRC - N provides Early Intervention services and screening services at the Pediatric Department of Indira Gandhi Government Medical College and Hospital (IGGMC), Nagpur.

Children under age 18 years are screened and are identified for Disability. Services like Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy & Special Education services are provided to the identified children with disability. Screening of the neonates and children further aims towards primary and secondary prevention of disability by making the parents aware about the normal developmental milestones, early intervention, therapies, rehabilitation and

home activities & plans. High risk Neonates are screened once a week for Hearing Loss by means of Oto acoustic Emissions test (OAE). Those failing the screening are then referred for BERA testing & further management.

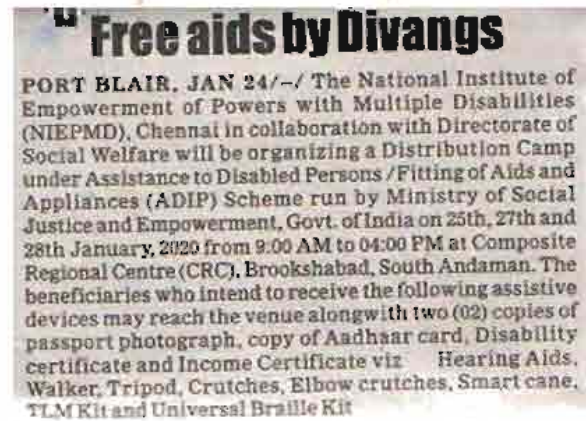

CHAPTER 20

Accounts and Finance Department

Preamble

Accounts department plays a pivotal role in achieving the objectives of the NIEPMD by providing a reliable framework that consistently, produce accurate financial information.

Objectives

- To provide a basis for performance assessment of NIEPMD.
- Budgeting gives a framework to coordinate and develop the different segments of NIEPMD.
- To highlight the key performance indicates; to submit financial projections and compare the past performance.
- To place necessary internal controls within NIEPMD for the safeguarding of its resources.

Out of the total grants-in-aid of Rs.59.33 crores received from DEPwD, MSI&E, New Delhi during the year 2019-20 (NIEPMD-Main A/c Rs.34.84 crores, ADIP A/c. Rs.3.0 crores, CRC-Kozhikode Rs.6.45 crores, CRC-Nagpur Rs.8.42crores, CRC-Gorakhpur Rs.1.84 crores, CRC – A & N island Rs.1.05 crores, CRC-Sikkim – 0.75 crores, Internal Income of Rs.2.98 crores) (NIEPMD- Main A/c Rs.28.71 crores, CRC-Kozhikode Rs. 1.60 crores, CRC-Nagpur Rs.0.32 crores, CRC Gorakhpur – 5.56 crores) and Rs.36.19 Crores brought forward from the previous year (totaling Rs.95.52 crores), the Institute could utilize Rs.73.97 crores leaving a balance of Rs.21.55 crores (NIEPMD-Main A/c Rs.14.14 crores, SIPDA Rs.1.54 crores, ADIP Rs.1.57 crores, CRC-Kozhikode Rs.2.35 crores CRC-Nagpur Rs.1.31 crores and CRC-Gorakhpur Rs.0.47 crores, CRC-Sikkim – Rs.0.17 crores) as on 31st March 2020.

In terms of section 20(1) of C&AG's (DPC) Act, 1971, the CAG, New Delhi had entrusted audit of Annual Accounts of NIEPMD for a period of 5 years from financial year 2006 -2011, extended period of 5 years from 2010 - 11 to 2015 -16 and also extended further period of 5 years from 2016-17 to 2020-2021, vide letter No.1(33)-B(R) 2016,dated 26.12.2016 from U/S (Report), Department of Economic affairs (Budget Division) Ministry of Finance to the controller and Director General of India, New Delhi for auditing the Annual Accounts of NIEPMD.

For the financial year 2019 -20, the audited statement of accounts comprising of accounts statement, balance sheet, Income & Expenditure statement and receipts and payments details which were submitted to the Director General of Audit (Central), Chennai. The audit team was deputed by the Director General of Audit (Central), Chennai visited NIEPMD for audit from 18.11.2020 to 02.12.2020. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting, standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

- i. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii. The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by Government of India, Ministry of Finance.
- iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities Chennai as required in the rules and regulations of the Institute in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv. We further report that:

A. General

1. Investment in term deposit of ₹1 crore and ₹6.52 crore shown in the individual balance sheets of RCI project account and internal accrual accounts respectively. However, the consolidated account depicts only ₹4.90 crore in deposit accounts. The difference needs to be reconciled.
2. Provision for Retirement benefits was not made on the basis of actuarial valuation as prescribed in Accounting standard 15.

B. Effect of revision in accounts

Accounts of the Institute were revised on the basis of audit observations. As a result of revision, Assets and Liabilities increased by ₹36.09 crore and deficit increased ₹1.22 crore

C. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Separate Audit Report have been brought to the attention of the Institute through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

D. Grants in aid

The institute received ₹55.46 crore as grants-in-aid for the year 2019-20 and an unspent balance of ₹48.24 crore of previous year was available, totaling to ₹103.70 crore. Out of this, the institute could utilise a sum of ₹79.86 crore, leaving a balance of ₹23.84 crore as on 31st March 2020.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with Accounting principles generally accepted in India.
 - a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of National Institutes of Empowerment of persons with Multiple Disabilities, Chennai as at 31st March 2020; and
 - b. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account of the deficit for the year ended on that date.

Please refer to the Separate Audit Report on the audit of annual accounts of the National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities, Chennai for the year 2019-20 issued on .07.2021. I wish to bring the following defects noticed in the accounting practices/procedures to your attention for remedial action.

1. An amount of ₹ 31.23 lakh utilized for the work of compound wall was omitted to be reduced from 'advance to CPWD' in schedule 11 of CRC Kozhikode though it was included in 'Capital work in progress'
2. Value of temporary building worth ₹ 1.40 lakh not belonging to the institute has been accounted in the Fixed Assets schedule 8 of CRC Gorakhpur resulting in overstatement of buildings to the extent.
3. Funds were shown as utilized- ₹ 105.02 lakh and ₹ 57.50 lakh by CRC, Andaman & Nicobar and CRC Sikkim respectively in schedule 3 of main accounts. However, category wise breakup (Capital or Revenue) and head of account wise breakup under each category were not shown distinctly.

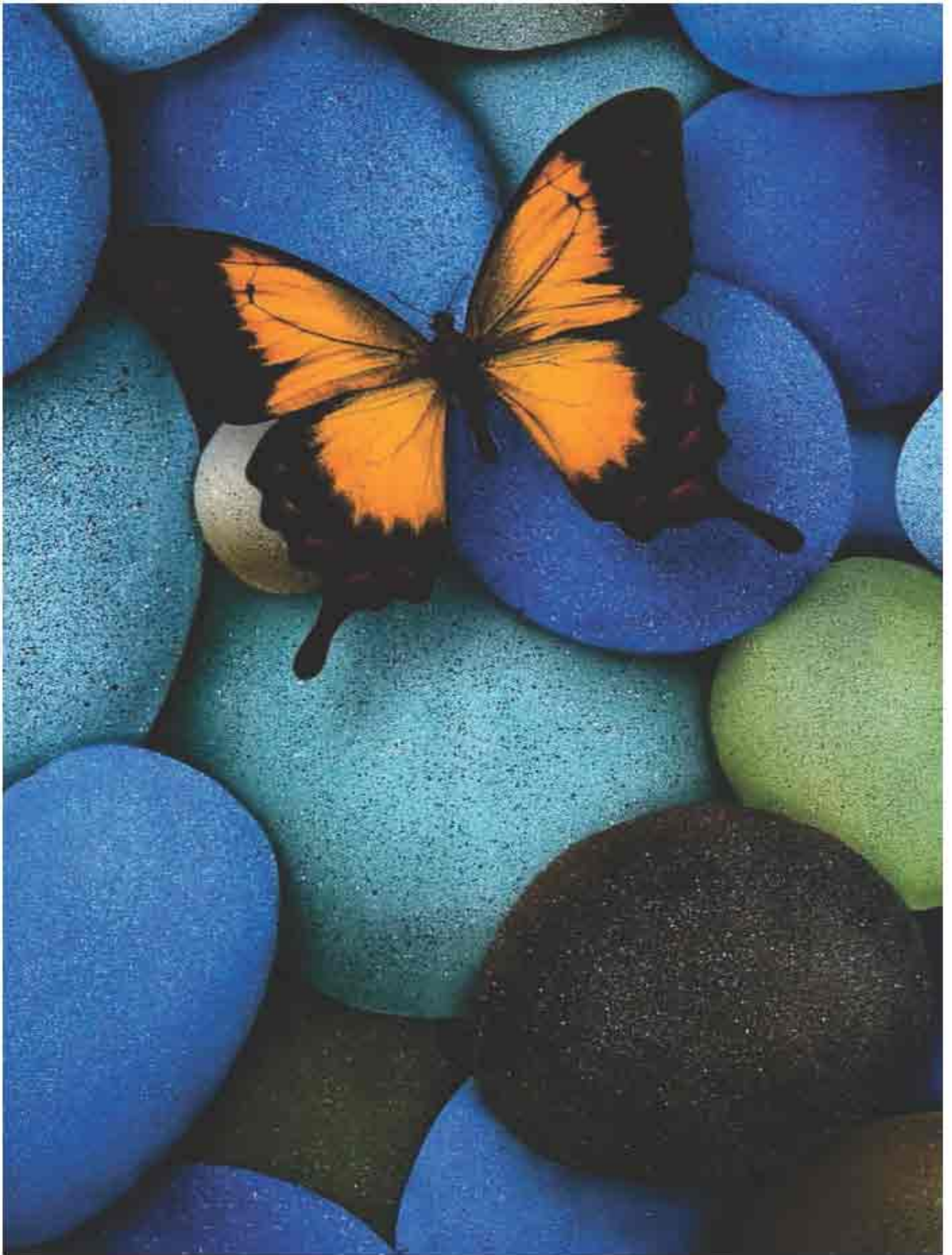
