

1. Introduction:

Maintaining a clean and hygienic environment is essential for the health and well-being of all individuals.



The COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted the importance of good hygiene practices, and the need for individuals, communities, and institutions to take proactive measures to reduce the spread of illness.

SOP has been developed as part of special campaign 2.0, building upon the previous Swachht Bharat initiative, with a focus on promoting sanitation and hygiene for children with disabilities in India.

SOP guidelines provide practical guidance on how to implement in different settings.

By following SOP, individuals, communities, and institutions can play a vital role in promoting public health and the wellbeing of children with disabilities in India.

2. Basics:

1. Hand Wash:

 Build time into daily routines for children and staff to wash hands, especially at key times like after bathroom breaks, before lunch, or after playing outside.



2. Social Distancing:

- Maintain a distance of at least 1 metre
- Keep hands clean
- Wear a mask indoors, and outdoors when physical distancing isn't possible



- Cover coughs and sneezes when not wearing a mask
- Open windows and doors to ventilate classrooms and common areas
- Get vaccinated.
- Remember to stay home when you are feeling unwell.
- Display Signage and markings for enforcing physical / social distancing and safety protocols.

3. Garbage Disposal:

- Remove garbage from dustbins and, if necessary, clean them.
- Provide separate dustbins for recyclable and non-recyclable materials.



- Return cleared trash cans to their original location.
- If any trash is found anywhere in the complex, pick it up immediately.

- 3. Guidelines Implemented by School in regards to Sanitation and Hygiene for Children with Disabilities: (24x7)
- At least 1 inspection a day may be recommended
- Ensure accessibility of toilet
- Accessible toilets include features such as
 - a) lower mirrors and
 - b) washbasins,
 - c) contrasting toilet seat colour,
 - d) grab rails and
 - e) braille signage.



- Training to staff and fellow students.
- Collaboration with relevant health authorities.
- Develop and implement policies and procedures to maintain cleanliness and hygiene standards in the school.
- Regularly monitor and evaluate the cleanliness and hygiene conditions in the school to ensure that they meet the necessary standards.
- Implement the school's policies and procedures for maintaining cleanliness and hygiene, as outlined in the <u>standard oper-</u> <u>ating procedure (SOP)</u>.

Accessible Toilets for Children with Disabilities:

- 1. Fixtures, including toilets and sinks, should be free of streaks, soil, stains, and soap scum.
- 2. Should have good-quality basic fittings like ablution taps and wash basins, etc.
- 3. Mirrors and windows should be free of dust and streaks.
- 4. Dispensers should be free of dust, soiling, and residue and should be replaced or replenished when they are empty.
- 5. Waste should be disposed of appropriately on a daily basis.
- Provisioning of soap, toilet paper, hand towel/dryer, sanitary pad dispensers, dustbins, and other necessary items
- 7. Toilet bowls, urinals, and adjoining areas should be cleaned with disinfectant on a daily basis, and the use of acid-based disinfectants should be avoided.



- 8. Toilet floors should be kept dry to the extent possible or feasible
- 9. There should be a well-functioning drainage system.

Playground:

- 1. Sweeping of the park and garden area regularly
- 2. Removing grass and hedge trimmings on the same day
- 3. Cleaning park benches and other outdoor equipment every day.
- 4. sweeping basketball court/volleyball court area
- 5. Ensure that no water trenches stay in the playground.

2.00pm to 3.30pm	Classroom activity with indigenous materials which is maintained with proper sanitation. Care taker and teacher should ensure safety of children by avoiding mouthing of the materials.		
3.30pm to 3.35pm	Screening of temperature and recording in the student dairy Ensure sanitation of van driver and other persons working in the school van and marking of the seats with social distance. Sanitation of the students hand and bags prior to boarding into the bus. Allow students to board the bus with social distancing.		
9am to 3.30pm	Visitors allowed only in Wednesday into Model school		
9.00 am to 3.30pm	Parents of children with special needs should be in waiting hall. In wait hall sanitation and hygiene have to provide in waiting area. Parents are allowed to school to see children in Break and lunch time
