"Over the years, Prabu showed resilience in the face of adversity and NIEPMD resource centre has supported him through his endeavours and will always try its best to provide better opportunities," quoted NIEPMD.

D. Madhan (24 years) received the Best Self-Employed with Disability – Male' under the entegory of Moltiple Disabilities, for the year 2020. He was dagnosed with cerebral pulsy with intellectual disability with 90% impairment. He enrolled in NEPMD and stud-



ied Special Education Training and Vocational Guidance and Counseling Services, and was trained in the skill training unit under the adult independent living skills programme.

In 2016, he joined the trade-based training under NIEPMD Skilling / Vocational scheme and learnt basic tailoring. After completing the training successfully, he started his own business 'Madhau Tailoring Works' with his purents. This initiative was supported and funded
